Candidates may be recommended for licensure in the following fields:





The accreditation term takes effect immediately and lasts through **June 30, 2028**, or until the University of Hawaii at Hilo ceases to be a member in good standing of AAQEP, whichever is earlier. Annual Reports are due by December 31 of each year, with the first report being due **December 31, 2022**.
