Panelist Biographies

Darren Iwamoto is currently the School Counseling Internship Director for Chaminade University's M.S. in Counseling Psychology School Counseling program. In addition, he is also an adjunct professor teaching various undergraduate psychology classes and graduate level counseling courses. Darren has been doing both since 2007. Prior to Chaminade University, he was a program coordinator for various social service programs through Hale Kipa, Inc., a private non-profit social service agency that focused their services on high-risk adolescents. He is presently an Ed.D. candidate at Capella University focusing his research on educational leadership and management. Darren is a nationally certified counselor (certification number 235773) and a licensed mental health counselor (MHC 187).

Scott Miyagi is in his 14th year of experience with the DOE. He has been a CSSS Resource Teacher at Lehua Complex, a School Counselor at Mililani Uka Elementary, and is presently a School Counselor at Mililani Mauka Elementary. Scott has a Masters of Education in School Counseling from UH Manoa (Spring 1998) and a Bachelors of Business Administration from UH Manoa (Fall 1993). At the present time Scott is the Conference Chair for the Hawaii School Counselor Association where he also has served as Treasurer and President (2004 and 2010). Additionally Scott is currently an Adjunct Professor with Chaminade in the MSCP Program.

Kristin A. Silva is an Outreach (High-Risk) Counselor at Washington Middle School where she has worked since 2000. In addition to her MEd in School Counseling (and School Counseling/Teaching License) Kistin became Nationally Certified through NBPTS in 2010. She is currently the Department Head, and sits on several leadership committees at WMS including the Key Staffers Committee (Safety & Security), Committee for School Improvement, Curriculum Committee, and Middle School Committee. Kristin was a faculty representative on her school's School Community Council for 4 years (2 terms) and the chairperson for two of the four years. She is currently leading her department in the development of a documented school counseling program for her school following the ASCA model.

Dr. Dale Fryxell obtained his B.A. in Sociology from the University of Minnesota, an M.A. in Teaching from University of St. Thomas, and an M.A. and Ph.D. in Psychology from the University of Hawaii at Manoa. He is currently a tenured Full Professor of Psychology at Chaminade University of Honolulu where he also serves as the Clinical Director for the School Counseling Program. At Chaminade University, as part of the counseling program, he has focused on teaching a variety of courses including Cross Cultural Counseling, Counseling Ethics, Human Development, Theories of Personality and Abnormal Psychology. His areas of interest include child development, parenting, positive behavioral supports, bullying prevention, and anger/violence prevention. He is also very interested in mentoring as both a prevention and early intervention strategy. DR. Fryzell has extensive experience working in various roles with many different State of Hawaii Departments and Programs including serving as an Autism Consultant for the Department of Health. In addition, Dr. Fryxell has been working with

the Primary School Adjustment Project (PSAP) for over 15 years. During this time he has worked with over 25 different schools and school-based counseling departments. He has also provided school and district-based training for PSAP EAs, Counselors, Parents and Teachers on a variety of school and behavioral topics. Currently, he is involved with many different schools in the Farrington complex working on a P-3 project for preschoolers and Kindergarteners. In addition, Dr. Fryxell has managed and evaluated a variety of youth and family intervention programs with numerous non-profit agencies in Hawaii.

Terry Ann L. Malterre is a School Counselor/ Outreach Counselor at Roosevelt High School. Currently she has a temporary assignment as Vice Principal. Terry has a Master in Counseling and Psychology degree from Chaminade University, a Certificated Program Professional Secondary Physical Education from Chaminade University (1997), and a B.A.in Physical Education and Health Education from the University of Hawaii, HI (1980). Terry is also the School Advancement Via Individual Determination (AVID) Coordinator, a member of the Honolulu District Counseling Steering Committee and the School Credit Recovery Coordinator. She is a member of the Hawaii School Counseling Association, the American School Counseling Association, the Hawaii Association for Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance, and the American Driver and Traffic Safety Education Association. Terry also received the following awards: American School Counseling Association, 2011 Top Ten Counselor of the Year, and Hawaii School Counselors Association, 2010 Secondary Counselor of the Year.

Charlene Masuhara has been a teacher and counselor at Hilo High School for more than forty years. She received a BEd and a MEd from the University of Hawaii at Manoa and a Masters in Counseling from the Ohio State University. Her work in education includes advising the award-winning Hilo High Key Club and the Hawaii State Championship Academic Decathlon team.
