 - The purpose of this portion of the executive meeting is to consult with the board's attorney on questions or issues regarding the board's powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities pursuant to Hawai'i Revised Statutes ("HRS") 92-5(a)(4).
- D. The purpose of this agenda item is to discuss the appropriate action to take on NBI 23-38; Case No. 23-12 pursuant to HRS 92-5(a)(1), regarding this educator's license. In Case No. 23-12, the educator applied to convert a currently held Provisional License to a Standard License. It is alleged that the educator falsified documents required to meet the criteria to obtain a Standard License.
- E. The purpose of this agenda item is to discuss the appropriate action to take on NBI 23-39; Case No. 23-13 pursuant to HRS 92-5(a)(1), regarding this educator's license. In Case No. 23-13, the educator permanently surrendered a teaching license in Ohio, had a teaching license revoked in Delaware, and had a teaching license revoked in New Jersey. The disciplinary actions taken from these three states stem from this educator submitting an altered or bogus teaching license to a prospective employer.
- F. The purpose of this agenda item is to discuss the granting of a posthumous teaching license to an individual in NBI 23-40; Case No. 23-14 pursuant to HRS 92-5(a)(1).

Testifiers will be called on and unmuted to give their testimony at the appropriate time in the agenda. Testimony must be related to an item that is on the agenda.
