TITLE: Out-of-State Teacher Candidates Enrolled in an Approved HTSB Educator Preparation Program Prior to November 19, 2021

The Hawaii Teacher Standards Board (HTSB) approves the following requirement for all teacher candidates enrolled in a Hawai'i State Approved Teacher Education Program (SATEP) prior to November 19, 2021, and are completing their clinical experience, student teaching, internship, or residency in a school outside the State of Hawaii:

Teacher Candidates who started their Education Preparation Program (EPP) prior to November 19, 2021, and are completing their clinical experience, student teaching, internship, or residency in a school outside the State of Hawaii will have until, June 30, 2024, to complete this portion of their program.

HTSB approved SATEPs are required to report to HTSB any teacher candidates that will be completing their clinical experience, student teaching, internship, or residency in a school outside the state of Hawaii by March 1, 2023.

Names not reported to HTSB by March 1, 2023, or teacher candidates who have not completed their clinical experience, student teaching, internship, or residency by June 30, 2024, will be required to complete their clinical experience, student teaching, internship, or residency in a school in Hawaii in order to be recommended for a Hawaii license.

Teacher candidates who are unable to complete their clinical experience, student teaching, internship, or residency in Hawaii may request HTSB to Suspend their Rules in accordance with Hawaii Administrative Rules §8-54-16.

Rationale/Background:

In accordance with NBI 12-27 Revised adopted by the Board on November 19, 2021, all teacher candidates shall complete their clinical experience, student teaching, internship, or residency. This NBI is in alignment with HTSB's Mission and Vision, which is to provide Hawaii students with highly qualified teachers.

Teacher Candidates who started their Education Preparation Program (EPP) prior to November 19, 2021, and are completing their clinical experience, student teaching, internship, or residency in a school outside the State of Hawaii will have until, December 31, 2023 June 30, 2024, to complete this portion of their program.

HTSB approved SATEPs are required to report to HTSB any teacher candidates that will be completing their clinical experience, student teaching, internship, or residency in a school outside the state of Hawaii by March 1, 2023.

Names not reported to HTSB by March 1, 2023, or teacher candidates who have not completed their clinical experience, student teaching, internship, or residency by December 31, 2023 June 30, 2024, will not be granted an exception and will need to complete their clinical experience, student teaching, internship, or residency in a school in Hawaii in order to be recommended for a Hawaii license.

Rationale/Background:

In accordance with NBI 12-27 Revised adopted by the Board on November 19, 2021 September 16, 2022, all teacher candidates shall complete their clinical experience, student teaching, internship, or residency. This NBI is in alignment with HTSB's Mission and Vision, which is to provide Hawaii students with highly qualified teachers.
