Requirements for a Standard License

Revised 01/2023

A Standard License may be issued to teachers who have three (3) or more years of full-time teaching experience within the last five (5) years in a P-12 contracted position from a school in Hawai'i or another U.S. state. This license is a NASDTEC Stage 3 License. A Standard License is valid for five (5) years and expires on June 30th. This license is renewable.

Option C: Out-of-State Valid License Holders (Reciprocity)	Possess a valid unrevoked provisional, or equivalent, teaching license from another state issued for the first time on or after July 1, 2006. <i>Submit HTSB Form OS3009</i> . **Note: Issued for the first time prior to 2006 requires basic skills and content knowledge verification.
Option D: National Board Certified Teacher	Hold a valid National Board Certification in the license field. Submit a copy of your official letter.
Option E: Performance Assessment	Pass a board-approved performance assessment normed for Hawai'i in combination with any other requirements determined by a Hawai'i preparation program to be recommended for licensure by the program. The Hawai'i SATEP will send a recommendation to HTSB. Meet basic skills and content knowledge requirements. Additional information may be requested.

Maintenance for a Standard License

Apply to renew your Standard License as early as **January 1st** of the year that it expires.

****Note:** During HTSB's peak application period, it may take up to six (6) weeks for your application to be processed, especially if licensing specialists are waiting on supporting documentation from agencies, schools, or organizations.

Submit your documents in PDF, Word or JPG/JPEG format to your HTSB online account in the *Documents* tab. Information on your valid government-issued photo identification must match the profile information on your HTSB account and all submitted documents. Further documentation may be required if needed.
